

For his solo exhibition Wollemi, Mark Dober presents work developed whilst undertaking a residency at BIGCI (Bilpin International Ground for Creative Initiatives) an artistic residency located in the Hawkesbury. Dober's large scale multi-sheet drawings convey a sense of immersion; of being within and enveloped by the environment.

EMA SHIN I HEARTS OF ABSENT WOMEN

10 FEBRUARY - 6 APRIL

EXHIBITION AT HAWKESBURY REGIONAL GALLERY

Artist Ema Shin is from a Korean family who immigrated to Japan in the 1930s. Born and raised in Japan, she moved to Australia in 2010. As part of a Korean tradition, Shin's male family members keep a book illustrating their family tree. Shin's family tree spans 32 generations, yet only the linage of sons is featured. All daughters are absent.

Hearts of Absent Women celebrates the women who are not recognised in Shin's family tree. Her work is influenced by anatomy and botanical forms. She sees these as symbols of life and emotion. Shin highlights the cultural diversity of women living in Australia, drawing attention to their experiences with family and social expectations. She celebrates their resilience and achievements. The exhibition includes handwoven tapestry, printmaking, installations, soft embroidered sculptures, and digital prints. The works in this exhibition have been made over the course of twelve years, which is how long Shin has lived in Australia.

WORKSHOP: ECO DYING AND BOTANICAL PRINTING WITH SAMANTHA TANNOUS

SATURDAY 25 MARCH, 11AM - 3PM

Let's play with plant materials to extract dyes and prints onto fabric and paper! Participants will learn a range of simple yet effective techniques to create beautiful results. Tutor Samantha Tannous will show participants how to make bundles with plant materials such as leaves, skins and flowers, wrapping around a wooden dowel or an old tin can, experimenting with shibori – Japanese tie-dye – to create stunning patterns, as well as hapa zome, using a rubber mallet to imprint flowers onto paper. Each participant will be given a range of silks and printmaking papers to create with Samantha suppling a range of different plants, flowers and equipment for use on the day. Includes all materials, morning and afternoon tea.


Paradise Gardens at Cattai was one of the many amusement parks that provided entertainment in Greater Sydney during the 1970s to 1980s. It was once famous for its giant dinosaur replicas but its memory has since disappeared into obscurity. Through photographs, video footage and souvenirs, this exhibition explores the history of this family fun park.

Archaeological excavations near Thompson Square between 2016-2020 revealed Aboriginal tools for hunting and fishing, maritime objects, as well as everyday items from colonial life. These artefacts divulge more than 27,000 years of human history. Also included in this exhibition are intricate sections of the brick drainage system dating to 1814-1816 and a digital recreation of some of the earliest remains of a colonial carvel built timber vessel. 11 Stories from the River are site-specific, downloadable audio walks, accessible via QR codes presented on signs that will be installed along 11 locations on the Hawkesbury/Dyarubbin river. Underscored by original music, the audio walks will share stories of the history of Dyarubbin's first people, the Dharug, colonial contact and settlement, geographic features, flood and famine, environmental concerns of what sustainability and rights for the river could look like and much more.
