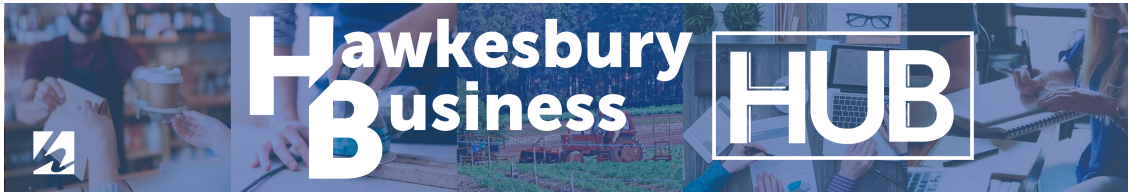

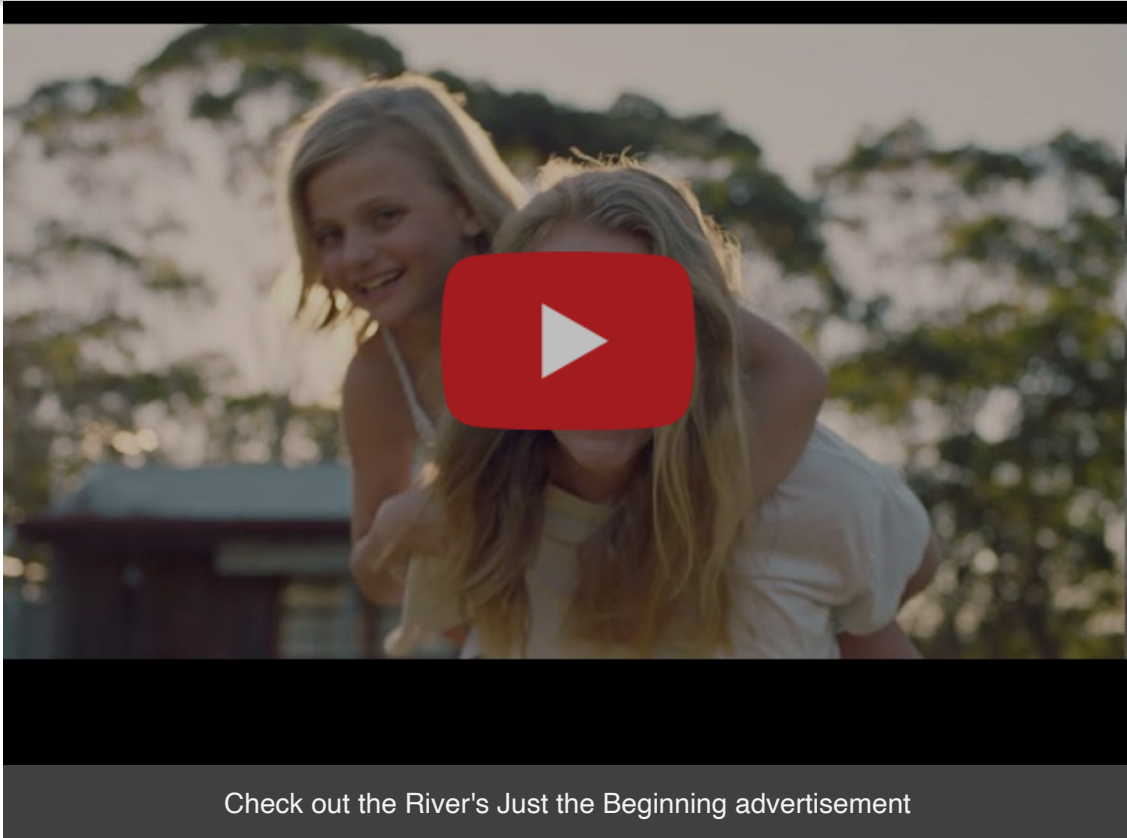
The River's Just the Beginning

[ATO reveals key JobKeeper dates, urges employers to get ready](#)

On 21 July, the Government announced it is extending the JobKeeper Payment until 28 March 2021 and is targeting support to those businesses and not-for-profits which continue to be significantly impacted by the Coronavirus.

From 28 September 2020, eligibility for the JobKeeper Payment will be based on actual turnover in the relevant periods, the payment will be stepped down and paid at two rates.

Further changes were announced on 7 August 2020 to adjust the reference date for employee eligibility and make it easier for organisations to qualify for the JobKeeper Payment extension from 28 September 2020.

Reduce Waste, Increase Recycling and Save Money

Independent Bin Trim assessors are conducting free waste assessments to businesses in your area. Bin Trim is run by the NSW EPA as part of the Waste Less, Recycle More initiative.

[Bin Trim](#) assessors provide free waste assessments and ongoing support to help businesses recycle more and reduce waste sent to landfill. The NSW Government recently launched its [COVID-Safe Summer Plan](#). It is made up of the five following pillars:

1. Marking out safe distancing in our parklands and highly visited public spaces from the beginning of October
2. Encouraging all beachgoers to 'Keep a beach towel length between you' (1.5 metres) and anyone not from the same household
3. Running a COVID-Safe summer program of events in our parklands and public spaces
4. Encouraging local businesses to take advantage of outdoor dining
5. Partnering with councils on a 'new local' campaign to showcase alternative public spaces for the community to enjoy.
