► 28 In your view, what aspects of the organisation of the Hawkesbury Macquarie 2010 Celebrations were ineffective and would need to be improved if the same approach is used to co-ordinate a similar events in the future?

"Communication - both to events organisers and in marketing to the community. Creative marketing is essential in this age". "From an outsiders point of view, the effectiveness of achieving clear purpose, agreed goals and cohesiveness within the committee needs refining".

"Use of logo. Logo was great but I don't believe people knew could use it or how".

" Funding opportunities generally precede the actual celebration by 12-24 months. Although we met first in Jan 2009 in many cases grants for 2010 had already closed. The committee itself was ineligible to apply for grants".

"Some requests for help with posters for Macquarie and also some roses were knocked back. This did not affect the event but was disappointing as it felt like a lack of co-operation".

"A learning process - the community organisations and council did well any future approach will work better. A shame that key financial support from the Richmond Club did not eventuate".

"I would like to see the open area of the Deerubbin Centre used for events".

"To celebrate the contribution of Governor and Mrs Macquarie to the State of NSW and particularly in the Hawkesbury. To actively involve the community in working together for a common good, following traditions& instilling a sense of belonging". "Great to see co-operation between Council and community organisations - recognition of our local heritage and history". " Interpretive signage project for the Governor Macquarie statue. Number of community groups participating during the year". "raise awareness of the contribution of the Macquarie's to NSW and in particular to the Hawkesbury". "Awareness of the contribution by Gov. L. Macquarie to the Hawkesbury promoted the district's background"

"The ship has sailed as far as bicentenary is concerned. Maybe a historical display showing the Hawkesbury's development through time - art and history marketed to young adults. Maybe some show - Macquarie the Man - in a relevant way"

"Promote local Artists and Artisans and the rich legacy that these members past and present attribute to the region."

"Fostering the historical aspects of the Hawkesbury through the presentation of events eg, "Sale of Wife"

"Council could select a few people within Council to assist celebrations especially, historically to prepare a program and or activity for upcoming events".

"The opportunity for many like minded community groups to co-ordinate significant activities in co-operative and not competition or clashes was a great achievement which benefitted each group".

"Promoting the past for the future is always historically viable depending on themes and notable people. There is no reason why such events cannot be staged for centenaries and bicentenaries".

"Why not have (a smaller) standing committee (Council and community) that meets say 3/4 times a year to look at options and then expand as appropriate. Hawkesbury should take part in crossing of Blue Mtns 1813/2013".

"Making connections. Mosaic footpaths inserts from Hawkesbury Museum through Windsor Mall to Hawkesbury Regional Gallery & Hawkesbury central Library. Araluen Cultural Precinct/ Alice Springs was excellent mosaics. Museum end to have historical content. Mall to tell story of agriculture, commerce. Then final section story of Art & Literature. Work to be undertaken by art students/uni & high school/local artists & art groups".

"Have a look for significant anniversaries of buildings, events e.g. Windsor Public School, St Matthews Anglican Church, Bridge to Bridge"

► 32 Do you have any comments or preference for how events such as the Macquarie 2010 Celebrations should be organised?

"Better. I am an events manager so did not need to attend events training, but obviously I missed some important info! Young people need to be included on the planning committee as I never expect a group of old people to think of Facebook as a marketing tool. I do think the community based events was a brilliant idea, it just was not done as well as it could or should have been done".

"Lachlan Macquarie celebration".

"Preparation, assistance with marketing, signage and advertising".

"Council should construct a listing of historical events or sites when and where these could be celebrated. Some people or organisations don't realise what history they have eg. Scots Uniting Church Pitt Town is 150 years old in 2012. Assistance would be much appreciated".

"Build on the strategies & networks already established but require members to more actively participate by expecting attendance commitments. Limit the committee to regular attendees perhaps as representatives of community group ie. make them accountable to the organisations they represent. Limit rep/group to two max".

"The theme of the celebration must be sufficiently broad to encompass all the community. The Macquarie 2010 celebrations just past were a good pilot to what can be achieved and fine tuned for the future".

"Use the same or similar approach".

"Maybe an umbrella event e.g. a dinner or concert, then ask others to initiate as happened for the Macquarie 2010 events".

"That the district supported a project". "Awareness of our history & heritage in Hawkesbury"

"Highlighting the unique history of Hawkesbury in that we are special "Gov Macquarie came past here" and left his mark" "Community participation. Many cultural events. Increase tourism to area".

" I think it probably brought the different areas into a different feeling of unity and cohesiveness. Most people should now know what a Macquarie Town is".

"To involve the community in activities of its own making with diverse celebrations following a common theme, that of honoring the achievements in his time of Governor Macquarie and Elizabeth Macquarie. To celebrate locally Macquarie's vision for the five Macquarie towns".

► 26 How can this achievement be built on in the future? Do you have any recommendations or suggestions for ongoing programs and activities which Council could consider?

"Follow up - Feed back to the community - Further involvement - a focus group to promote the district both within & without". "A 'bigger' Proclamation Day event."

"Creating Gov Macquarie Festival as a annual event".

"Perhaps proclamation day held in December could be built upon to include the "Five Towns" & promoted more widely with rep's from each town etc".

"If there was some way Australiana Village could be reopened it would keep tourists happy. I know insurance is a deterrent but more could be made of the river. Canoes, padaes. Please keep agriculture and historic buildings".

"Using the above as a recommendation and modifying the constitution as needed, this inaugural celebration could be utilised again, drawing on its positive aspects for engaging the community in cultural activities. A committee could discuss future events that would appeal to a diverse range of people for the best community participation".
