Pratia purpurascens (White Root)

Description

A small leafy herb and scrambling groundcover.

Flower and Foliage

Small white to pale purplish pink flowers in summer and autumn. Small green toothed leaves, with purple colouring underneath. Distinctive white succulent roots that spread easily.

Maintenance

Prune or mow to control. Can become a problem in ornamental/vegetable gardens; so keep away, particularly in Queensland and Northern NSW.

Occurs

Common on moist sheltered forest floors and will tolerate most soil types.

Uses

Used in revegetation along riverbanks. Groundcover for most areas and under trees. Plant between stepping stones or crazy paving; along paths, around ponds, rockeries, hanging baskets etc.
