29 OCTOBER 2022 – 5 FEBRUARY 2023 AT HAWKESBURY REGIONAL GALLERY

Dyarubbin, the Hawkesbury River has been the spiritual, cultural and physical home to the Dharug people for millennia. Despite periods of loss and devastation, including the frontier wars from 1794, Dharug people still live and thrive on Dyarubbin. This exhibition shares Dharug stories of Dyarubbin using oral histories, art and Dharug language, empowering us with a greater understanding of this astonishing landscape and its culture.

This exhibition highlights research by Professor Grace Karskens in 'The Real Secret River, Dyarubbin', a collaborative project with Leanne Watson, Jasmine Seymour, Erin Wilkins and Rhiannon Wright which won the SLNSW Coral Thomas Fellowship and featured in the SLNSW exhibition of the same name.



EXHIBITION: PARADISE LOST

ON DISPLAY NOW

Paradise Gardens at Cattai was one of the many amusement parks that provided entertainment in Greater Sydney during the 1970s to 1980s. It was once famous for its giant dinosaur replicas but its memory has since disappeared into obscurity. Through photographs, video footage and souvenirs, this exhibition explores the history of this family fun park.



EXHIBITION: UNCOVERED **ON DISPLAY NOW**

Archaeological excavations near Thompson Square between 2016-2020 revealed Aboriginal tools for hunting and fishing, maritime objects, as well as everyday items from colonial life. These artefacts divulge more than 27,000 years of human history. Also included in this exhibition are intricate sections of the brick drainage system dating to 1814-1816 and a digital recreation of some of the earliest remains of a colonial carvel built timber vessel. 11 STORIES FROM THE RIVER

FIRST SIGN IS AT THE MUSEUM NOW. MORE TO COME THIS YEAR. 11 Stories from the River are site-specific, downloadable audio walks, accessible via QR codes presented on signs that will be installed along 11 locations on the Hawkesbury/Dyarubbin river. Underscored by original music, the audio walks will share stories of the history of Dyarubbin's first people, the Dharug, colonial contact and settlement, geographic features, flood and famine, environmental concerns of what sustainability and rights for the river could look like and much more.
