

Jobkeeper Payment and Income Support Extended

In reassuring news for businesses, the JobKeeper Payment will now be extended by six months to 28 March 2021 and the temporary Coronavirus Supplement for those on income support will be extended until 31 December 2020.

On 11 March 2020, the Morrison Government announced a Small Business Rebuild Package focused on local government areas (LGAs) that have been most impacted by the Black Summer bushfires.

- the Commonwealth and states working together to make concessional loans for indirectly affected businesses easier to access and manage; and
- extra support people in existing Bushfire Recovery Centres, including 21 new business advisers (BAs).
