

Sunset Dolphins

Materials


- Paper (print out the template)
- Lead pencil
- Ruler
- Watercolour paints or watercolour pencils
- Paintbrush
- Cup of water




Instructions

If you are using **watercolour paints**, blend one colour to the next lightly as you add each colour. If you are using **watercolour pencils**, colour the whole picture as instructed and then blend with water at the end (see step 8)

1. Print out the dolphin template (you can either colour this page or if you don't want an outline, lightly trace onto a new piece of paper)




2. Draw a straight line across your page just below the two tiny dolphin silhouettes (this will be our horizon line – above the line is the sky and below the line is the sea – we are colouring the reflection of the sky in the sea



3. Start with **yellow** colour a small curved area above and below the horizon line



4. Next use **orange** to apply another curve layer around the yellow and along the rest of the horizon line







5. Add **pink** this layer will be more straight across rather than curved line the yellow and orange



6. Above the pink, colour a line of purple



7. Fill in any leftover space with blue



8. If you are using watercolour pencils blend the colours with water and paintbrush mixing lightly where each colour meets the next (yellow to orange, orange to pink, etc)
