PROPOSAL FOR INCREASE IN BUDGET ALLOCATION

Reference is made to the Draft Operational Plan as presented on the Hawkesbury City Council website.

On review of this Plan it has been noted that as in previous years, Hawkesbury Sports Council's allocation will only be increased by the anticipated C.P.I. increase.

Since the establishment of Hawkesbury Sports Council in 1991 there has only been 1 significant increase in the budget allocation. That increase in allocation was supported by Clr. Tiffany Tree in 2010 and was for \$30,000 to employ an apprentice groundsman. The apprentice that was employed (Ben Pollard) is fully qualified and is now employed as head groundsman on a considerably higher salary.

Most of the facilities are now at the stage that they required significant upgrading and maintenance and Hawkesbury Sports Council Inc. is requesting that an allocation of \$150,000-\$200,000 be made annually to be utilised as infrastructure Renewal for the sports facilities.

Below are actual income and expenditure figures for the last three years. These figures indicate that there is a considerable shortfall in the existing income and that Hawkesbury Sports Council Inc. are subsidising the Hawkesbury City Council budget allocation significantly. This subsidisation is used in 2 areas:

- 1. To support Capital Works Programs.
- 2. To subsidise the Operational Income.

The provision of the \$150,000 - \$200,000 Infrastructure Renewal Funding is requested for a minimum of 5 years with a review of the process at the conclusion of this period.
