Revitalising Our Town Centres - Update

Masterplans are being developed to help revitalise the town centres of Richmond, South Windsor and Windsor for locals and visitors alike, while investigating new and improved elements to be included in the town centres, some of which may be implemented in other towns and villages.

Extensive stakeholder engagement commenced in November 2019 using streetwalks, online surveys, post-cards and pop-up community engagement sessions.

A Town Centre Masterplan Working Group meeting and Councillor workshop have just been held to share findings from the consultation as well as copies of the draft Master Plan and Public Domain Plan. The plans will be finalised and sent to a future Council meeting. Following this, the plans will be placed on public exhibition.
