Acacia linifolia (Flax-leafed Wattle)

Description

A graceful open shrub with slender arching branches covered in foliage.

Occurs

Occurs on sandstone & clay soils. Likes well-drained light-heavy soils. Does not like dry soils.

Uses

Excellent around ponds or pools as a light screen or background plant. Its flowers and seeds will attract insects and birds; especially in winter.

Flower and Foliage

Creamy yellow flowers, forming in dense clusters at the end of the branches from December to April, with a second flowering season in winter. Soft fine evergreen foliage.

Maintenance

Acacias are short lived (7-15 years). Tip prune green growth annually to increase foliage and flowers and to extend longevity. Remove dead wood as required. May need to be watered during long dry periods in summer.














