Revitalisation Town Centres - Update

As part of Council's Town Centre Liveability Project for Windsor, Richmond and South Windsor, a Draft Master Plan has been created to bring these town centres to life. Thank you to all those businesses and members of the community who gave us feedback on the plans.

Different projects have been developed for each of the three centres and detailed designs will now be prepared.

Windsor:

<u>George Street</u> - a boulevarde of trees seating, lighting, places for outdoor dining, street art and cleaning

<u>Windsor Mall (North & South)</u> - tree planting, seating, lighting and cleaning <u>Thompson Square</u> - upgrade of the outdoor dining area and cleaning

South Windsor:

<u>George Street</u> - a boulevard of trees linking McLeod Park to the station with new seating parklets where people can sit

<u>Bereewan Park</u> - tree planing, creation of a network of paths, investigation of a community garden

Richmond:

<u>Windsor Street</u> - a boulevard of trees, lighting and new seating parklets where people can sit

Apple orchard recovery grants available

Bushfire-impacted apple growers now have access to a \$31 million grants program to help progress their recovery efforts.

Grants of up to \$120,000 per hectare are available to eligible growers. They can be used to:

- replace stock (apple trees of any variety), damaged irrigation infrastructure, poles, trellises, and netting
- clean-up damaged infrastructure or undertake site preparation not funded through other programs.

In order to be eligible, apple growers must:

- be a primary producer
- hold an ABN that was active at the time of the eligible disaster
- be located within a NSW local government area declared as a disaster area for the 2019/2020 bushfires
- have had apple orchards that suffered direct damage by bushfires since 31 August 2019
- have been in active production immediately prior to the fires
- match the grant dollar-for-dollar with a private financial co-contribution.

All funded activities covered by these grants will need to be complete with all funding expended by 30 June 2023.

Modern Manufacturing Initiative

The Australian Government is manufacturing a new future for our nation through the \$1.5 billion Modern Manufacturing Strategy.

The centrepiece of the Strategy is the \$1.3 billion Modern Manufacturing Initiative (MMI), which will see the Government strategically invest in projects that help manufacturers to scale up and create jobs.

The MMI will support projects within six National Manufacturing Priorities which reflect Australia's established competitive advantages or emerging areas of priority:

- Resources technology and critical minerals processing
- Food and beverage
- Medical products
- Recycling and clean energy
- Defence
- Space

The Strategy is a key feature of the Government's JobMaker plan to harness Australian manufacturing capability and drive our economic recovery and future resilience.

- \$52.8 million expansion of the <u>Manufacturing Modernisation Fund (MFF)</u> (this link is to the prior 2019 MMF Round 1) that supports transformation in small and medium manufacturing businesses. Round 2 of the MMF is planned to launch prior the end of 2020 and provides co-funded grants to upgrade manufacturing processes and grow highly skilled workforces.
- \$107.2 million Supply Chain Resilience Initiative will support projects that address an identified supply chain vulnerability. incentivising industry to take advantage of opportunities to provide both domestic and global supply chains with critical products
