Culturally Significant Parks and Reserves

This list is compiled from the categories as suggested at the public hearings for the categorisation of community lands and those categories that Council staff believe are relevant. Some of the reserves suggested by the community have not been included in the recommended list upon advice from Council's cultural heritage advisor.

Aboriginal sites require confirmation from Aboriginal organisations prior to Council adopting this category. Consultation will be undertaken at the same time as the community consultation and cultural significance recommendations relating to items of Aboriginal significance will be made to Council after the consultation period.

New Park Park Name / Address Justification of Staff Recommendations Land Park No. Owner No. 2 Yarramundi Reserve – Springwood Road, Yarramundi No Aboriginal artefacts have been found however the reserve was a traditional resource area and a 267 Crown significant site for collection of raw materials for the manufacture of stone artefacts. Named after Yellomundi, an important Aboriginal figure in the early colony. Reserve area is referenced in records of early explorers. . Unnamed – 1A Lieutenant Bowen Drive, Bowen Some evidence that part of the route through this parcel was first developed by Matthew Everingham in 21 7 Council 1795?, Carving on rock face (dated 1809) along fire trail, possibly made by Archibald Bell, surveyor Mountain Charles Kemp Recreation Reserve – 286 Tizzana Road, Aboriginal Cultural Significance - engravings, artefacts. Registered site. 43 162 Council Ebenezer 45 Argyle Bailey Memorial Reserve Cultural significance refers to quarry site for sandstone for Ebenezer Church, landing beach. 146 Crown Streeton Lookout – 548 Terrace Road, Freemans Reach Named after Arthur Streeton – he painted his world famous painting 'The purple noon's transparent 51 185 Council might" on this escarpment west of the reserve – approximately opposite Wire Lane. Some Aboriginal silcrete artefacts have been discovered on site. Cultural Significance - Mill Race, Mill Stone and associated foundations of dwellings 82 37 McMahon's Park Crown 154 Mill Road 85 Matheson Park Cultural Significance refers to the site being old police station and convict camp at time of construction 38 Crown 6 Mill Road of Bells Line of Road, and the road down to Singleton Mills 90 Kurrajong Heights Park The area of cultural significance – the old zig zag road from Warks Hill Road to Bells Line of Road is 15 Council not part of the park land parcel even though it passes through the Crown land portion of the park. 1449-1463 Bells Line of Road and Crown 108 241 Half Moon Farm – 205 Upper Half Moon Road, Lower Cultural Significance - Cemetery dating from 1812, ruins of Church of St Rose of Lima & Aboriginal Dept. Portland open site. Council paid for half the purchase cost of this land. Land was meant to be handed to Planning Council for management. Richmond Park - 180 Windsor Street, Richmond Cultural significance refers to park itself, landscape style, trees etc 98 144 Council Unnamed - 23a William Cox Drive or Castlereagh Adjoins Hobartville Stud - the park was once part of the main entrance to this historic property 145 96 Council Road, Richmond
