

Caesia parviflora (Pale Grass-Lily)

Description

An erect grass-like lily.

Flower and Foliage

Small flowers are whitish and tinged with purplish or blue stripes from spring to summer. The filaments are green. It has grass-like leaves.

Maintenance

Very hardy & low maintenance. Water if begins to dry out and keep weed free.

Occurs

Found in grassland and moist dense undergrowth, together with grasses on sandstone and Cumberland Plain.

Uses

A plant for small gardens, narrow borders and tubs. The roots are edible. Ideal as a filler or specimen plant in an existing garden.
