

Eucalyptus paniculata

(Grey Ironbark)

Description

Deeply furrowed grey-brown rough bark (distinctive 'ironbark').

Flower and Foliage

Cream flowers from May to August. The glossy leaves are paler on the under surface.

Maintenance

Prune to remove dead wood. Prune to a single leader or allow multiple trunks that are well spaced for future growth.

Occurs

Found on heavy, loamy soils with a clay base, shale capped ridges and plateaus.

Uses

Ideal in a parkland or for acreage, as a feature tree, shade tree or a windbreak. Attracts native fauna especially as it flowers in cooler months when less natives are in flower. Valued as a strong and durable timber and for honey production.
