That development application DA0710/08 at Lot 15 DP 843883, 3 Duke Road WILBERFORCE NSW 2756 for Subdivision - Two Lot Subdivision be refused for the following reasons:

Reasons for Refusal

- 1. The proposed development is inconsistent with the aims and objectives of Hawkesbury Local Environmental Plan 1989.
- 2. The proposed subdivision fails to comply with the minimum allotment size of 4000m² as required under Clause 12 (3) of Hawkesbury Local Environmental Plan 1989.
- 3. The proposed subdivision fails to comply with Clause 25 (2) of Hawkesbury Local Environmental Plan 1989 relating to development of flood liable land.
- 4. The application does not demonstrate that the proposed development is consistent in respect to Clause 18 of Hawkesbury Local Environmental Plan 1989 in that arrangements satisfactory to Council has not been provided in respect to the provision of sewerage disposal.
- 5. The site is unsuitable for the proposed development due to the impact of flooding.
- 6. The design of the proposed development will not provide an acceptable level of amenity for future residential development on the land.
- 7. The proposed development is inconsistent with the aims and objectives of Hawkesbury Development Control Plan.
- The proposed development does not comply with the requirements of Hawkesbury Development Control Plan, in particular Part D Chapter 1 - Residential, Clause 1.18 - Effluent Disposal; Part D Chapter 3 - Subdivision, Clause 3.6 - Flooding, Landslip & Contaminated Land; Part D Chapter 3 -Subdivision, Clause 3.7.5 - Lot Size and Shape.
- 9. The development application does not demonstrate that the site is suitable for the sustainable disposal of effluent generated by the proposed development.

10. The development application does not demonstrate that future development of the land will not unreasonably impact on adjoining properties due to filling required on the land and amenity issues associated with the future construction of any buildings on proposed Lot 152.

1	Rasmussen	Commented that he noticed that Council had received \$9.8Million for a recycling program for the South Windsor Sewerage Treatment Plant and the Hawkesbury Farmers scored really well with \$21Million for metering.	The Mayor advised that it wasn't an issue about new money, but grant money that is the ongoing issue of Council trying to fund infrastructure.
2	Reardon	Asked if the street sweeper services could be extended to the carpark adjacent to the Museum in Windsor.	The Director Infrastructure Services advised that this carpark should already be on the Street Sweeping Program and he will investigate the matter.
3	Reardon	Asked if extra carparking and signage for public toilets could be erected in Windsor.	The Mayor advised the Director Infrastructure Services had informed him that Coles also wanted to discuss with Council carparking signage, so this issue could be addressed then.
4	Whelan	Referred to the carpark between the Museum and the Macquarie Arms Hotel and commented that it had been reported that food scraps left in there has encouraged a plague of rats. He enquired whether Council has a vermin eradication program	The Director Infrastructure Services advised that Council did not have a formal vermin eradication program, but in any case he would clean up the area.
