









# Seascape Sunset

## Step by Step Instruction Sheet

Start your path to becoming a master painter following these simple instructions on how to paint a seascape sunset. Here you will discover different layering techniques, which are easy and fun, that when combined create a dramatic effect you can try again and again on other amazing artworks at home!

<p><b>Step 1</b></p> 	<p>Draw a light line across the page and another line at a slight angle joining the first one.</p>	<p><b>Step 2</b></p> 	<p>Squeeze out some of the cobalt blue paint and make it nice and watery. Next paint nice long brush strokes starting at the top of the page, stopping part of the way down the page.</p>
<p><b>Step 3</b></p> 	<p>Quickly, while your paint is still wet, use a tissue to wipe streaks of paint into the top of the page, starting from the centre and wiping out.</p>	<p><b>Step 4</b></p> 	<p>Next squeeze out some yellow paint and fill in the remaining white section of the sky and a section below the horizon line.</p>
<p><b>Step 5</b></p> 	<p>Now for the orange! Once again make a watery wash and making sure to leave some of the yellow showing through, paint over the yellow with some of the orange, adding to the warm glow in the sky</p>	<p><b>Step 6</b></p> 	<p>Taking the Ultramarine blue paint now, squeeze out only a tiny amount as it is very dark, and paint in blobs in the sky. Follow this by covering the bulk of the water below the horizon.</p>
<p><b>Step 7</b></p> 	<p>Now, mix up a little yellow and a little white, and paint in the sun hiding behind the clouds and some wiggly outlines around some of the clouds closest to the sun.</p>	<p><b>Step 8</b></p> 	<p>Last Step! Paint in the land mass in the distance nice and neatly, aiming to get it nice and solid, and then your seascape sunset is done!</p>
