

# Angophora floribunda

## (Rough-barked Apple)

### Description

Medium sized to large tree that is long lived. A fibrous, rough-barked trunk. Great character with its domed canopy.

### Flower and Foliage

Clusters of creamy white flowers in spring and summer. Light green evergreen foliage.

### Maintenance

Avoid pruning to let it take on its own natural and interesting branch habit. Frost sensitive when young.

### Occurs

On alluvial and clay soils that can be moist and close to watercourses. Avoid water logged soils.

### Uses

Ideal habitat tree for its hollows. Attracts an array of native fauna for the nectar, seed and insect feeders. Yellow-Bellied Glider favours it as a sap feeder tree. Good street tree, as it tolerates various soils; but avoid power lines or planting too close to buildings.
