



<u>Spendmapp</u>, developed by Geografia, is an economic modelling tool used by several local government areas to measure consumer spending of locals and visitors geographically using bank data.

The tool helps Local Council's and businesses gain a better understanding of the local economy by providing an insight into the visitor economy, online expenditure and escape expenditure. Using the data helps determine patterns of spending and can assist with managing and responding to long term economic trends and shocks.









February's visitor spending had an increase in *Transport*, *Professional Services* and *Specialised & Luxury Goods* from the previous month. Meanwhile there was a decrease in spending for *Grocery Stores & Supermarkets* and *Dining & Entertainment*.

For the second month in a row, the category *Professional Services* has replaced *Specialised Food Retailing* to be in the top 5 categories of visitor local spending.

Resident spending in February shows an increase in *Transport* and *Specialised Food Retailing*. There was a decrease in spending of *Grocery Stores & Supermarkets, Dining & Entertainment* and *Specialised & Luxury Goods*.

The NSW Government is making it easier for farmers to use their land for agritourism. The changes allow farmers to use exempt and complying development processes, which are quicker, cheaper and simpler than making development applications to a local council.

New Active and Creative Kids Voucher Program

The new Active and Creative Kids voucher is now available, helping to make activities more affordable for eligible NSW families.

Parents, guardians, and carers of eligible school-aged children will be able to use two \$50 vouchers per calendar year.

About the new program

- Vouchers are available to those receiving Family Tax Benefit Part A, or Family Tax Benefit Part B, or both
- Vouchers can be downloaded as a QR code and used toward either an eligible physical or creative activity
- The \$50 vouchers will be issued in school term 1 and school term 3
- Vouchers must be redeemed before their expiry date

Love Food, Hate Waste?

Do you love food but hate waste? Hawkesbury City Council has put together some helpful tip for businesses on how to reduce waste and work more sustainably.

Register your business for a BYO container scheme

Demonstrate your commitment to reducing single-use plastic waste by registering your business with <u>BYO Containers.</u>

Check what produce is in season

Reduce food wastage by planning meals based on what produce is in season. Use seasonal guides made by organisations like <u>Sustainable Table</u> to assist you in checking what's in season throughout the year.

Donate your excess food

According to <u>Foodbanks 2023 Hunger Report</u>, 3.7 million Australian households experienced food insecurity last year. Meanwhile, our 7.6 million tones of food is wasted in Australia every year. Help reduce food waste by helping those who are struggling to put food on the table. Free Food Handler Training for Standard 3.2.2A

Food service, caterier and related retail businesses in NSW need to meet new food safety requirements in the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code (the Code). The requirements apply to most businesses from 8 December 2023.

School canteens, children's services that supply food, supermarkets, greengrocers, delis, coffee vendors that sell food, correctional centres and boarding schools have until 8 December 2024 to comply.

Standard 3.2.2A aims to improve food safety by introducing 3 tools:

- Food Safety Supervisor (FSS)
- Food handler training
- Showing food is safe

If you already have a current FSS, you will only need to ensure other staff who handle unpackaged, potentially hazardous food have appropriate skills and knowledge in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk businesses must also be able to show they are managing key food safety risks.

For other businesses, all the requirements are new, such as for children's services that supply food, school canteens, supermarkets, greengrocers, delis, coffee vendors that sell food, correctional centres, and boarding schools.

The requirements do not apply to the handling or sale of food for fundraising solely for community or charitable causes, providing food free to the community, or to businesses licensed with the Food Authority.

Fireworks Displays

All pyrotechnic displays, celebrations and promotions require a pyrotechnicians license or fireworks (single use) license issued by <u>SafeWork NSW</u>.

The licensee must notify SafeWork NSW and the local council of an intention to use any fireworks, crackers, distress signal or model rocket propellant device at least 7 working days before the fireworks, signal or device is to be used.

Liquid Trade Waste - What is it?

Liquid trade waste is all liquid waste generated from industrial and commercial premises that is discharged to the sewer system. Does not include human personal hygiene waste.

Does my business need a Liquid Trade Waste Approval with Hawkesbury City Council?

Energy efficiency grants for small and medium enterprises

Applications for Round 2 of the Energy Efficiency Grants for Small and Medium Sized Enterprises have recently opened, supporting eligible businesses to upgrade or replace inefficient equipment to improve energy efficiency.

The grant program aims to help businesses reduce their energy usage, manage long term energy costs, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and contribute to Australia's target of a 43% reduction on 2005 emission levels by 2030.

Bin Trim Equipment Rebates Program

As of November 2023, new rebates have become available as part of the Bin Trim Equipment Rebates Program.

The program, which provides rebates of \$50,000 to cover up to 50% of the cost of small-scale, on-site recycling equipment or technology, is available to businesses, councils, and government organisations.

\$6 million is available for rebates until 30 June 2027, or until all funding is exhausted.



New platform helps small business with tax and super

The ATO has launched a new online learning platform offering free courses to help small business owners and operators with their tax and super obligations.

The <u>Essentials to strengthen</u> <u>your small business</u> website includes more than 20 short courses and a calendar of key lodgment due dates.

Content includes videos, case studies, audio content and written information, as well as the option to test your knowledge with quick quizzes. The content focuses on areas where small business owners often make mistakes, such as the GST and business deductions and also offers help on core business management issues.

This program helps regional NSW businesses in identified industries attract skilled and specialised employees from NSW metropolitan areas, interstate or internationally, to regional NSW. Funding of up to \$12,500 is available. More information

Electric vehicles rebate

The NSW Government is offering \$3,000 rebates for the first 25,000 new battery electric and hydrogen fuel cell vehicles with a dutiable value of less than \$68,750. This incentive, along with the abolition of stamp duty, will save eligible EV purchasers up to \$5,540. More information

Small Business Export Loan

The Small Business Export Loan provides small to medium export businesses with loans to cover up to 80% of the costs to secure an export contract or purchase order with an overseas buyer. Loans of between \$20,000 and \$350,000 are available, to cover up to 80% of your export contract(s) or purchase order(s). More information
