

Hawkesbury Community Nursery





The Hawkesbury Community Nursery is a predominately volunteer run Nursery that propagates Hawkesbury Indigenous plant species.

The facilities at the Nursery include a polyhouse, potting shed, shade houses, outdoor plant storage areas, native seed storage bank, as well as a community building.

Members of the public are welcome to take advantage of these facilities to learn about propagating local native plants. Propagated plants can be used for the purposes of landscaping, erosion prevention, native animal habitat or bushland restoration projects. Plants can be purchased from the Nursery during opening hours however if you require a bulk purchase it is suggested that you order prior to the date required.

Located at 10 Mulgrave Road, Mulgrave, next to the Companion Animal Shelter, the Hawkesbury Community Nursery is open to the public weekly on Wednesdays from 9am to 1pm or by appointment.
